Two hours away from Mombasa in rural coastal Kenya is a home for the homeless. Mutongoi is a Kamba word meaning 'leader' and was used in the Kamba Bible to describe Moses as the spiritual leader of Israel. Mutongoi is home to over 60 people; orphans, youths whose families can't look after them, kids who have run away from abusive parents, and widows.

Over the past eight years Agape in Action has been helping support the work of Bro. Sammy and Sis. Christine with sponsorship for many of the children and construction of dormitories, kitchen and dining/study hall for the children living here. Sustainable farming initiatives are in place and continue to be developed to provide food for the home. Some local members of the ecclesia are employed to help with the cooking and farming.

WHO AM I HELPING?

The kids that live here come from many different backgrounds, some having witnessed and experienced things we can only imagine.

Three sisters escaped from a government orphanage where they were neglected and starved and travelled 100 km to get here, knowing that Sammy would help them.

Two siblings from a nearby property would sneak into the dormitories and try to blend in amongst the other kids, because their father would beat them at home

Three siblings whose parents both died from AIDs and they only have a 96-year-old grandmother attempting to care for them.

Two orphaned refugee boys from Burundi.

They all have their own sad stories to share.
